Executive Summary:

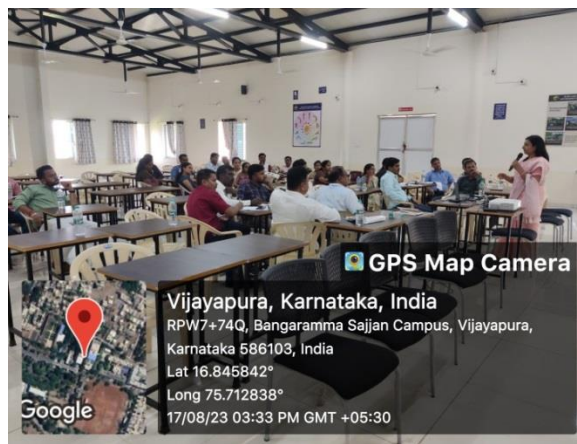

The FDP covered various topics related to effective teaching, instructional design, and leadership skills.

Inaugural Function: The programme started with lighting of lamp at Inaugural Ceremony, where Dr. BS Hunasagi Organising secretary in his welcome address welcomed Dr. Jayaraj sir, Dr. Kotnal sir,; Dr, Mallikarjuna setty principal. 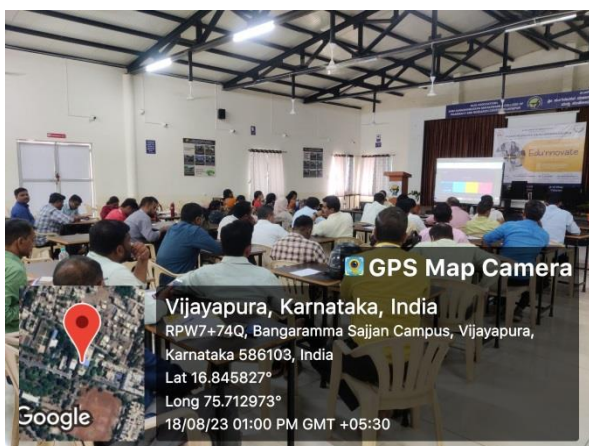
Day 1: Introduction to Pedagogy

The FDP commenced with an inaugural session, followed by a keynote address by an esteemed educator. The focus was on the importance of pedagogy in modern education. Workshops and group discussions introduced participants to key pedagogical concepts, including active learning strategies and collaborative learning techniques. Total 37 members were present.



Day 2: ICT in Teaching

Day 2 delivered on integrating technology. Facilitators discussed the significance of ICT in teaching, and addressing challenges of ICT in teaching and how to apply them in their teaching. Total 43 members were present



Day 3: Academic excellence

This day explored about the effective communication in the classroom. Sessions covered the use of digital tools, Learning Management Systems (LMS), and assessing students learning outcome. Participants had hands-on experience with various digital platforms. Total 44 members were present



Day 4: Human values and caring

The fourth day of the FDP explored student support and engagement. Facilitators presented case studies of successful educators who have implemented innovative approaches in their classrooms. Participants engaged in brainstorming sessions to develop academic and personal growth. Total 42 members were present



Day 5: capacity building

Day 5 focused on leadership and administration. Participants were exposed to various decision making and problem solving situations, including leadership styles. The importance of providing constructive feedback to students was emphasized. Total 42 members were present



Day 6: Effective Classroom Management

The sixth day was dedicated to classroom management techniques. Educators learned strategies for maintaining a positive learning environment, handling disruptions, and fostering student engagement. Case studies and role-playing exercises on learning to learn were used to illustrate effective practices. Total 43 members were present

In the last session from 3.00 PM to 5.00PM valedictory function was conducted where the Chief guest Dr. Jayaraj sir and the resource persons were felicitated and certificates were distributed to the faculty participants.
